### Conceptual Requirements:

For this project, declare an interest of yours in the form of a written concept. The execution of your project should be the embodiment of your written concept, and all decisions relating to its production should also be in service to this idea.

### Technical Requirements:

Your work should be rooted in still images. Beyond that, think of the process as malleable to bend in the service of your written concept. Experiment with anything that may aid in its communication. Techniques such as compositing, assemblage, or some type of digital or physical manipulation if required are all valid options. However be selective and specific about how you are employing any technique. High quality prints, or print based work is required for your final final presentation.
